

JESUS IS GOD, WAS CRUCIFIED, ROSE TO LIFE AND IS GLORIFIED

When Muslims try to understand who Jesus really was, they are taught Jesus was a prophet, but not the Son of God, nor was Jesus crucified or raised from the dead. They are falsely taught that Jesus is not the pathway to heaven. Because of the false teaching they receive, they cannot enter heaven and will be cast out to the outer darkness on Judgment Day by Jesus himself. Only the Bible is the truth. The truth of Jesus is in every book of the Bible. **In the Gospel of John there are 61 Bible verses that prove the Koran is wrong. Jesus is the only way.**



Listed below are some of the verses in the Koran that give false teaching about Jesus:

The Koran wrongly says Allah has no Son

Koran 17:111 "And say, All praise is for Allah, who has never had any son or offspring; nor does He have a partner in governing the kingdom; nor is He pathetic, needing a protector. And revere Him immensely."

Koran 21:26 And they say, "The Most Merciful has taken a son." Exalted is He! Rather, they are but honored servants.

The Koran wrongly says Jesus was not crucified

Koran 4:157 And their saying, "Indeed, we have killed the Messiah, Jesus, the son of Mary, the messenger of Allah." And they did not kill him, nor did they crucify him; but another was made to resemble him to them. And indeed, those who differ over it are in doubt about it. They have no knowledge of it except the following of assumption. And they did not kill him, for certain.

The Koran wrongly says Jesus was not God

Koran 19:30-36 Jesus declared, “I am truly a servant of Allah. He has destined me to be given the Scripture and to be a prophet. He has made me a blessing wherever I go, and bid me to establish prayer and give alms-tax as long as I live, and to be kind to my mother. He has not made me arrogant or defiant. Peace be upon me the day I was born, the day I die, and the day I will be raised back to life!” That is Jesus, son of Mary. And this is a word of truth, about which they dispute. It is not for Allah to take a son! Glory be to him. When he decrees a matter, He simply tells it, “Be!” And it is! Jesus also declared, “Surely Allah is my Lord and your Lord, so worship Him alone. This is the Straight Path.”

GOD ONLY GIVES GLORY TO GOD

The prophet Isaiah makes clear that God only gives glory to God. If Jesus received glory from God, it means that Jesus must be God. We are also taught this in Psalm 29.

Isaiah 42:8-9 (NASB)

“I am the Lord, that is My name; I will not give My glory to another, Nor My praise to graven images. “Behold, the former things have come to pass, Now I declare new things; Before they spring forth I proclaim them to you.”

Psalm 29:1-2 (NASB)

**Ascribe to the Lord, O sons of the mighty,
Ascribe to the Lord glory and strength.
Ascribe to the Lord the glory due to His name;
Worship the Lord in holy array.**

Everything in creation exists for the glory of God, including ourselves. Whatever we do, we are to do for the glory of God. We spread the Gospel for the glory of God. We obey God's word for the glory of God. We submit to those who are over us and we endure suffering and persecution for the glory of God. The Father glorified his Son Jesus to provide our plan of redemption.

Glory means honor or honorableness. When we honor someone, we publicly show the value that we have toward that person. The Greek word for honor is doxa, from which we get the words orthodox ('correct worship') and doxology ('words of praise'). Praise and worship glorify God because through them, we honor Him by publicly telling how much we value Him, expressing His worth to us.

To glorify God is to show others that we recognize Jesus as our Lord and King. It is to make man aware of His awesome power and majesty, so they will also fear Him.

Listed below are 61 Bible verses from the Gospel of John that make clear Jesus is the Son of God, was glorified by God, was crucified, was raised from the dead and is one with the Father.

Proof #1 John 1:29 (NASB) Jesus is the Lamb of God

The next day he saw Jesus coming to him and said, “Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!”

Proof #2 John 1:34 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

“I myself have seen, and have testified that this is the Son of God.”

Proof #3 John 1:35-36 (NASB) Jesus is the Lamb of God

Again the next day John was standing with two of his disciples, and he looked at Jesus as He walked, and said, “Behold, the Lamb of God!”

Proof #4 John 1:49-51 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

Nathanael answered Him, “Rabbi, You are the Son of God; You are the King of Israel.” Jesus answered and said to him, “Because I said to you that I saw you under the fig tree, do you believe? You will see greater things than these.” And He said to him, “Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see the heavens opened and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man.”

Proof #5 John 2:19 (NASB) Jesus will raise back up after three days

Jesus answered them, “Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up.”

Proof #6 John 3:16 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

“For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life.”

Proof #7 John 3:17 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

“For God did not send the Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world might be saved through Him.”

Proof #8 John 3:18 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

“He who believes in Him is not judged; he who does not believe has been judged already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.”

Proof #9 John 3:35-36 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

“The Father loves the Son and has given all things into His hand. He who believes in the Son has eternal life; but he who does not obey the Son will not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him.”

Proof #10 John 5:18 (NASB) Jesus is equal with God

For this reason therefore the Jews were seeking all the more to kill Him, because He not only was breaking the Sabbath, but also was calling God His own Father, making Himself equal with God.

Proof #11 John 5:19 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

Therefore Jesus answered and was saying to them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of Himself, unless it is something He sees the Father doing; for whatever the Father does, these things the Son also does in like manner.”

Proof #12 John 5:20 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

For the Father loves the Son, and shows Him all things that He Himself is doing; and the Father will show Him greater works than these, so that you will marvel.

Proof #13 John 5:21 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

“For just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, even so the Son also gives life to whom He wishes.”

Proof #14 John 5:22 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

“For not even the Father judges anyone, but He has given all judgment to the Son,”

Proof #15 John 5:23 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

“so that all will honor the Son even as they honor the Father. He who does not honor the Son does not honor the Father who sent Him.”

Proof #16 John 5:25 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God—the dead hear his voice

“Truly, truly, I say to you, an hour is coming and now is, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live.”

Proof #17 John 5:26-27 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God—has authority to judge

“For just as the Father has life in Himself, even so He gave to the Son also to have life in Himself; and He gave Him authority to execute judgment, because He is the Son of Man.”

Proof #18 John 6:27 (NASB) Jesus has the seal of God

“Do not work for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give to you, for on Him the Father, God, has set His seal.”

Proof #19 John 6:35 (NASB) Jesus is the bread of life

Jesus said to them, “I am the bread of life; he who comes to Me will not hunger, and he who believes in Me will never thirst.”

Proof #20 John 6:40 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

“For this is the will of My Father, that everyone who beholds the Son and believes in Him will have eternal life, and I Myself will raise him up on the last day.”

Proof #21 John 8:24-28 (NASB) Jesus says “I am He”

“Therefore I said to you that you will die in your sins; for unless you believe that I am He, you will die in your sins.” So they were saying to Him, “Who are You?” Jesus said to them, “What have I been saying to you from the beginning? I have many things to speak and to judge concerning you, but He who sent Me is true; and the things which I heard from Him, these I speak to the world.” They did not realize that He had been speaking to them about the Father. So Jesus said, “When you lift up the Son of Man, then you will know that I am He, and I do nothing on My own initiative, but I speak these things as the Father taught Me.”

Proof #22 John 8:42 (NASB) Jesus comes from God

Jesus said to them, “If God were your Father, you would love Me, for I proceeded forth and have come from God, for I have not even come on My own initiative, but He sent Me.”

Proof #23 John 8:51 (NASB) The words of Jesus give eternal life

“Truly, truly, I say to you, if anyone keeps My word he will never see death.”

Proof #24 John 8:58 (NASB) Jesus said “I am”

Jesus said to them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was born, I am.”

Proof #25 John 9:35-38 (NASB) Jesus is worshiped

Jesus heard that they had put him out, and finding him, He said, “Do you believe in the Son of Man?” He answered, “Who is He, Lord, that I may believe in Him?” Jesus said to him, “You have both seen Him, and He is the one who is talking with you.” And he said, “Lord, I believe.” And he worshiped Him.

Proof #26 John 10:14-15 (NASB) The Father knows that Jesus lays down his life

“I am the good shepherd, and I know My own and My own know Me, even as the Father knows Me and I know the Father; and I lay down My life for the sheep.”

Proof #27 John 10:17-18 (NASB) Jesus lays down his life voluntarily

"For this reason the Father loves Me, because I lay down My life so that I may take it again. No one has taken it away from Me, but I lay it down on My own initiative. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again."

Proof #28 John 10:33 (NASB) Jesus makes himself to be God

The Jews answered Him, "For a good work we do not stone You, but for blasphemy; and because You, being a man, make Yourself out to be God."

Proof #29 John 10:36 (NASB) Jesus says "I am the Son of God"

"If he called them gods, to whom the word of God came (and the Scripture cannot be broken), do you say of Him, whom the Father sanctified and sent into the world, 'You are blaspheming,' because I said, 'I am the Son of God'?"

Proof #30 John 10:37-38 (NASB) The Father is in Jesus

"If I do not do the works of My Father, do not believe Me; but if I do them, though you do not believe Me, believe the works, so that you may know and understand that the Father is in Me, and I in the Father."

Proof #31 John 11:4 (NASB) Jesus says "the Son of God may be glorified"

But when Jesus heard this, He said, "This sickness is not to end in death, but for the glory of God, so that the Son of God may be glorified by it."

Proof #32 John 11:25-27 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me will live even if he dies, and everyone who lives and believes in Me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to Him, "Yes, Lord; I have believed that You are the Christ, the Son of God, even He who comes into the world."

Proof #33 John 12:23 (NASB) Jesus is glorified

And Jesus answered them, saying, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified."

Proof #34 John 12:28 (NASB) Jesus is glorified

"Father, glorify Your name." Then a voice came out of heaven: "I have both glorified it, and will glorify it again."

Proof #35 John 12:45-46 (NASB) If you see Jesus you see the Father

"He who sees Me sees the One who sent Me. I have come as Light into the world, so that everyone who believes in Me will not remain in darkness."

Proof #36 John 13:31-32 (NASB) Jesus is glorified

"Therefore when he had gone out, Jesus said, "Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in Him; if God is glorified in Him, God will also glorify Him in Himself, and will glorify Him immediately."

Proof #37 John 14:6 (NASB) No one comes to the Father but through Jesus

Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me."

Proof #38 John 14:7 (NASB) If you see Jesus you see the Father

"If you had known Me, you would have known My Father also; from now on you know Him, and have seen Him."

Proof #39 John 14:8-10 (NASB) If you see Jesus you see the Father

Philip said to Him, "Lord, show us the Father, and it is enough for us." Jesus said to him, "Have I been so long with you, and yet you have not come to know Me, Philip? He who has seen Me has seen the Father; how can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Do you not believe that I am in the Father, and the Father is in Me?"

Proof #40 John 14:11 (NASB) The Father is in Jesus

"Believe Me that I am in the Father and the Father is in Me; otherwise believe because of the works themselves."

Proof #41 John 14:13 (NASB) The Father is glorified in the Son

"Whatever you ask in My name, that will I do, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son."

Proof #42 John 14:20 (NASB) Jesus is in the Father, and in us

"In that day you will know that I am in My Father, and you in Me, and I in you."

Proof #43 John 14:23-24 (NASB) Jesus and the Father both together come to believers

Jesus answered and said to him, "If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word; and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our abode with him. He who does not love Me does not keep My words; and the word which you hear is not Mine, but the Father's who sent Me."

Proof #44 John 14:26 (NASB) The Father sends the Holy Spirit in the name of Jesus

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I said to you."

Proof #45 John 14:28 (NASB) On earth the Father was greater as Jesus was not yet glorified

"You heard that I said to you, 'I go away, and I will come to you.' If you loved Me, you would have rejoiced because I go to the Father, for the Father is greater than I."

Proof #46 John 15:23-24 (NASB) If you hate Jesus you also hate the Father

"He who hates Me hates My Father also. If I had not done among them the works which no one else did, they would not have sin; but now they have both seen and hated Me and My Father as well."

Proof #47 John 16:14 (NASB) The Holy Spirit glorifies Jesus

"He will glorify Me, for He will take of Mine and will disclose it to you."

Proof #48 John 16:15 (NASB) All things the Father has belong to Jesus

"All things that the Father has are Mine; therefore I said that He takes of Mine and will disclose it to you."

Proof #49 John 17:1-2 (NASB) The Father glorifies Jesus

Jesus spoke these things; and lifting up His eyes to heaven, He said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify Your Son, that the Son may glorify You, even as You gave Him authority over all flesh, that to all whom You have given Him, He may give eternal life."

Proof #50 John 17:5 (NASB) The Father glorified Jesus before the world was created

"Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You before the world was."

Proof #51 John 17:10-11 (NASB) The Father and Jesus share all things--they are one

"All things that are Mine are Yours, and Yours are Mine; and I have been glorified in them. I am no longer in the world; and yet they themselves are in the world, and I come to You. Holy Father, keep them in Your name, the name which You have given Me, that they may be one even as We are."

Proof #52 John 17:21 (NASB) The Father and Jesus are in each other

"That they may all be one; even as You, Father, are in Me and I in You, that they also may be in Us, so that the world may believe that You sent Me."

Proof #53 John 17:24 (NASB) The Father gave Jesus glory before creation

"Father, I desire that they also, whom You have given Me, be with Me where I am, so that they may see My glory which You have given Me, for You loved Me before the foundation of the world."

Proof #54 John 19:7 (NASB) Jesus made himself out to be the Son of God

The Jews answered him, “We have a law, and by that law He ought to die because He made Himself out to be the Son of God.”

Proof #55 John 19:18 (NASB) Jesus was crucified

There they crucified Him, and with Him two other men, one on either side, and Jesus in between.

Proof #56 John 19:32-34 (NASB) Jesus died

So the soldiers came, and broke the legs of the first man and of the other who was crucified with Him; but coming to Jesus, when they saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs. But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out.

Proof #57 John 19:41-42 (NASB) Jesus was buried in the tomb

Now in the place where He was crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one had yet been laid. Therefore because of the Jewish day of preparation, since the tomb was nearby, they laid Jesus there.

Proof #58 John 20:16-18 (NASB) Jesus came back to life on the third day

Jesus said to her, “Mary!” She turned and *said to Him in Hebrew, “Rabboni!” (which means, Teacher). Jesus said to her, “Stop clinging to Me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to My brethren and say to them, ‘I ascend to My Father and your Father, and My God and your God.’” Mary Magdalene came, announcing to the disciples, “I have seen the Lord,” and that He had said these things to her.

Proof #59 John 20:20-21 (NASB) Jesus showed them His hands and his side

And when He had said this, He showed them both His hands and His side. The disciples then rejoiced when they saw the Lord. So Jesus said to them again, “Peace be with you; as the Father has sent Me, I also send you.”

Proof #60 John 20:27-29 (NASB) Jesus is God

Then He said to Thomas, “Reach here with your finger, and see My hands; and reach here your hand and put it into My side; and do not be unbelieving, but believing.” Thomas answered and said to Him, “My Lord and my God!” Jesus said to him, “Because you have seen Me, have you believed? Blessed are they who did not see, and yet believed.”

Proof #61 John 20:30-31 (NASB) Jesus is the Son of God

Therefore many other signs Jesus also performed in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these have been written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing you may have life in His name.

During the Sermon on the Mount, in Matthew chapter five, Jesus said: "*Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them.*" Some have wondered did Jesus teach that we are still under the law despite his sacrifice at the cross? It is especially important to note how the words are used in Matthew. In this context, "**abolish**" is set in opposition to "**fulfill**." Jesus, the perfect Son of God, did not come to earth as an opponent of the law. Jesus came to complete all law, and fulfill all prophecy concerning God's promise of redemption.



Jesus fulfilled all prophecy concerning God's plan of redemption given by the Old Testament prophets and by doing so he fulfilled the law for us--something no man or woman can do for themselves. What Jesus also taught was that we are still all under the law if we do not accept that Jesus was the Son of God, died on the cross, and rose to life on the third day. Yet no one can keep the law. His perfect sacrifice atones for a believer's sins and gives the only path to our Father in heaven.

IF YOU ARE A MUSLIM--WHAT DOES JESUS WANT YOU TO DO NEXT?

Did Jesus appear to you in a dream? Has the Holy Spirit visited you? Would just a prophet appear to you, or was it the Son of God, the risen Jesus? ***Yes, it was Jesus the risen Son of God! Jesus is appearing to many Muslims to give them the truth. He wants you to be saved.***

Muslims know the Koran teaches that Jesus was born of a virgin (19:20); that He is among those closest to God (3:45); that He taught a message of kindness and compassion (57:27); that He healed the sick and raised the dead by the power of God (3:49); that He miraculously fed the hungry (5:112.); that He is alive now in heaven (3:55); and that He will return at the end of the age (43:61).

Muslims also know the Koran says that Jesus is the Messiah and the Word of God (3:45 and 4:171).



At the same time, however, most Muslims have been told that Jesus did not die on a cross. They believe He did not rise from the dead or atone for human sin, and that people should not worship Him as God. When you take away these truths of Jesus—you take away his salvation for you. The truth is Jesus the Son of God, died for you and rose to life. This Jesus is the only path to God. Following any other path will result in being cast away from God on the coming Day of Judgment.

Muslims often feel most strongly, however, that it is deeply offensive to refer to Jesus as the Son of God. But Jesus himself said He was the Son of God when Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead. (John 11:4 When he heard this, Jesus said, “This sickness will not end in death. No, it is for God’s glory so that God’s Son may be glorified through it.”) So believe him!!

Muslims have been taught that the One God of Abraham is not triune (three in one) and has not become incarnate among us. Though they believe the New Testament, Torah, and Psalms are God’s inerrant Word in the original manuscripts, most have been told a falsehood that people have altered the original text that the Bible we have today is not reliable. The Bible text is reliable and true.

As a Muslim, you should do the following:

- ✓ Pray that you receive the Holy Spirit
- ✓ Read the Gospel of John—it will teach you that Jesus is the risen Son of God
- ✓ Ask a Christian friend to explain the Gospel to you

In John 15:7 Jesus said: ***“If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you.”*** Jesus will hear your prayers.

IF YOU ARE A CHRISTIAN--WHAT DOES JESUS COMMAND YOU TO DO?

The West is not dealing with Islam and Muslims according to God's will. We are in a vast spiritual war, and the West has been deceived to believe we are in a physical war. The spiritual war will never be won with tanks and armies. Only the true Gospel of Jesus defeats the satanic forces of the spiritual war. Jesus expects us to make disciples out of all people—including Muslims that have been taught a false doctrine about Jesus the risen Son of God.

Jesus commanded all Christians to share the Gospel. He commanded us to pray for our enemies. No one needs the true Gospel more than Muslims. Today many of us have Muslim friends or coworkers, or perhaps you know a Muslim thinking about God. The Prophet Joel promised us in the last days the true God's Spirit would be poured out.

Joel 2:28 (NIV)

And afterward, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, your young men will see visions.

Today Jesus is actively appearing to many Muslims in dreams. If a refugee or stranger asks you what their dream of Jesus means, what will you tell them? Jesus commands us to make disciples of all people. He also tells us to pray for those that do not know the Gospel. Jesus will answer our prayers. In the Gospel of John, Jesus said He will lose none of all those he has been, but raise them up at the last day. The Father's will is that everyone who looks to the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life, and Jesus will raise them up at the last day. The Bible tells us Christ will return soon. We need to gather as many souls as possible before Jesus returns in all His Glory. The harvest is very ripe—but the workers are too few in number.

As a Christian following Jesus, you should do the following:

- ✓ Pray that Muslims receive the Holy Spirit
- ✓ Give them an Arabic copy of the Gospel of John—it will clearly teach Jesus is the risen Son of God
- ✓ Be prepared to explain the Gospel to Muslims who have questions
- ✓ Be prepared to easily explain why the Gospel is true and was never corrupted
- ✓ Be prepared to explain the Triune God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) is much like water which also exists in three forms (ice, liquid, and steam) but it is still water
- ✓ Explain that the advocate (Spirit of Truth) that will live in us promised by Jesus in John 14 was the Holy Spirit and not a prophecy of the future false prophet Mohammad
- ✓ Explain that fulfilled prophecy only exists in the Bible and not the Koran
- ✓ Pray with Muslims every day that they understand the truth while there is still some time before Jesus returns and it is too late
